





Do you need to appoint a DPO?

You must appoint a DPO if:



You are a public authority (for instance a city council, a hospital governmental body); or



You carry out certain types of processing activities requiring regular and systematic monitoring of individuals on a large scale (for example, credit scoring, location tracking on mobile apps); or



Your core activities consist of processing special categories of data on a large scale (for instance, health data, racial or ethnic origins, political opinions, religious beliefs) or information in relation to criminal convictions.



In certain European jurisdictions, it is a formal requirement to appoint a DPO. For instance, German data protection law requires businesses employing a certain amount of staff to appoint a DPO, regardless of the nature of processing activities carried out.



More generally, even if you do not need to appoint a DPO, you may choose to do so anyway, as a matter of best practice.

The role of the DPO

Your DPO oversees the monitoring of compliance with data protection regulations. They are an advisor independent from the business and must be preserved from situations of conflict of interest. This is why the DPO should not be involved in making decisions about personal data processing activities. The DPO can advise you on data protection matters, and ensure your employees are aware of how personal data should be processed on a day-to-day basis. The DPO should be involved in all data protection related matters from the outset. The DPO role can be outsourced (DPO as a Service).

Outsourced DPO services

It is easier to manage the budget allocated to the DPO function by ensuring it strictly covers the tasks which should be undertaken by the DPO. Annual Planning

This is to plan the year ahead and prepare our report to the highest level of management of your organisation

Article 38(3) GDPR/UK GDPR

Your engagement letter will confirm that we have discretion in performing the DPO services. It will also specify the period of appointment and that termination cannot be because of our performance of the tasks of the DPO.

If the DPO has other tasks or duties, there must not be a conflict of interests

Article 38(6) GDPR/UK GDPR

Appointing an external DPO avoids a conflict of interest, as suitable internal resources are likely to be involved in decision making about personal data processing
